

Bhuragaon College is one of the pioneer higher education institutions in the district of Morigaon, Assam. The College is located to the north, approximately 20 kilometers, from the district headquarters of Morigaon, lying quite adjacent to the Brahmaputra

River which is hardly 300 meters away. Despite having innumerable hurdles and financial setbacks, the College can keep pace with the changing educational scenario that augments promises for aspirants to a new dawn of knowledge every day and every moment. The College was established on 20th February 1988. It has 20 bighas of land to accommodate any spacious educational infrastructure with the serene atmosphere that flows within from the longest northeastern river, the Brahmaputra. The College is working as a catalyst in offering a platform to cater to the social, educational, and psychological needs of the region which is marked by its multi-lingual and multi-cultural nature. Established some 35 years ago when barely there were more than two higher education institutions in Morigaon district, Bhuragaon College has been continuously and relentlessly developing and has been trying to keep its promises to disseminate knowledge and filter that to wisdom among every young aspirant to this beautiful abode for learning. The College would not have been in its present status, had there been no contributions by the thenlearning enthusiasts such as the Late Upendra Narayan Singh, Anand Mohan, Late Abdul Jalil, Manabendra Saha, Mihiram Bora, Sri Madharam kakati, and lot more others all of whose names I cannot mention here because of the paucity of space, but can remember with appropriate respect and reverence. A college that is haunted more than twice by the flash-flood of the Brahmaputra River which makes it impossible for any greeneries to grow on the campus, and still not to falter but to stand straight, is sufficient to prove its priceless efforts to sacrifice for a mission of extending its support to the needy who are more often from the extremely poorer section of the society. The College, though in a humble stage today even, yet it sustains to operate with its examination center and offers almost all the Arts subjects such as English, Assamese, Economics, Education, Political Science, History that have Honours courses, and Philosophy, Geography, and Arabic which have Regular or General courses. Besides having these, our college also takes its pleasure in announcing the introduction of Distance Learning courses from The IDOL, which run parallel with Regular courses under Gauhati University. Besides, our college offers the Scouts & Guides program as a certificate course to help secure government jobs for young aspirants.

Provincialization of the College in January 2021 proved a milestone moment for us. The college family is marching for goals that have remained unattained owing to geographical and financial setbacks. The College is a blooming ground for every student from diverse linguistic and cultural backgrounds, the uplifting for which generous hands came out with utmost philanthropy, I sincerely thank those graceful souls and individuals from the bottom of my heart and wish for all the success of Bhuragaon college in coming future.

- **2.1 Location**: Bhuragaon College is located near Bhuragaon Paachali by the Morigaon -Basnaghat-Bhuragaon state road.
- **2.2 Communication and Connectivity**: Bhuagaon College is in a geographical location where people can reach it from both Morigaon Town and Nagaon Town via Morigaon-Basnaghat-Bhuragaon road and Dhing-Laharight-Moirabari road. The College is nearly 20 km from the Morigaon district headquarters, 25 km from Jagiroad, and, 105 km from Guwahati city.

3 History:

Bhuragaon college is one of the premier higher education institutions in the state of Assam. This institution with promises and a vision was established on 20th February 1988. The College falls in Bhuragaon Revenue Circle under Laharighat Legislative Assembly Constituency in the Morigaon district. It is situated on the southern bank of the mighty Brahmaputra River approximately 20 kilometers north. It is an outskirt rural and flood-prone area metaphorically far from district headquarter, Morigaon. Since its inception,

by its educational norms and outcomes of performance, the college has been able to avail a distinguished place among the other prominent colleges in the district. The institution is an Arts Degree College affiliated with Gauhati University. It's important that the College might secure a distinct place in the arena of higher education in the state for its geographical positioning and situation as it is in a chronic flood-prone zone struggling more than once a year with the hideous flood-water from the most nearby mighty Brahmaputra which is hardly 500 meters away from the College. The rural nature of the College is so strong as to bear a capacity to cater to the higher educational needs of the poor families in a diameter of 30 kilometers where there is no higher education institution to opt for. As of now, the College is doing Arts subjects such as English, Assamese, Political Science, Economics, History, and Education having Major/Honours, and other subjects such as Geography, Philosophy, and Arabic teaching General subjects. The College too endeavors to add IDOL in its teaching-learning journey as part of the mission of disseminating knowledge and education to the outreach around the region.

Looking back to the past, apart from Morigaon College and Moirabari College, the district didn't witness the existence of any other Degree College during 1987-88. It was almost impossible for students from the greater Bhuragaon area to go to these colleges which was almost a distance covering 25 kilometers, and road, transportation, or communication facilities were a great deal hurdle some. Given all these communication setbacks and a thirst for the education of the generous and energetic people here, a few of the "willing to do" people, among whom renowned educationists, government civil servants, school teachers, and social workers were there, came out and held the first meeting convened at the premises of Haricharan Sarkar Higher Secondary School on 20th February 1988. The convenors—the then young and energetic MLA of Laharighat Assembly Constituency, late Nareswar Saikia from Bhuragaon Hindi Primary School, and others—whose bearing the torch proved so motivating that the first meeting registered the presence of more than five hundred enthusiasts from across Bhuragaon, Gerua, Japori, Sondoba, Pabhakati, Niz Saharia, Banmuri, Taptala, Hindujapari, Baralimari, and so on. The first organized public meeting proposed for the immediate establishment of a Degree College at Bhuragaon, and a governing body, to initiate the solemn purpose, was framed, whose details are as follows:

President: Late Upendra Narayan Singh

Vice President : Anand Mohan Secretary : Late Md Abdul Jalil

Joint Secretary: Sri Manabendra Saha

The first Governing Body had also other 20 members who were selected unanimously. Immediately, thereafter, the College was inaugurated on 20th February 1988, and the initial classes were taken within the premises of Haricharan Sarkar HS School under a teen roof and bamboo walls with 6 students. During all these, the man who was an integral part of everything was Sri Monilal Chauhan who has currently been also extending his services to the College as a Grade IV employee.

The journey was carried on with a lot of difficulties. Land, around 20 bighas, was proposed and allotted to the east of Bardoba Toop adjacent to Haricharan Sarkar HS School where the College now is situated. The first building was constructed under the MLA Development Fund from Laharighat Constituency. Helping Hands came out magnanimously and liberally to collect and procure construction materials from around the region. Passage of time brought the 3 km distant Brahmaputra to a distance of 500 meters. Still, efforts were on with sacrifices, and the College started to see the increasing number of students year by year.

During 2007-08, the College had to face severe encroachment from neighbouring victims of flood and erosion, but boldly that was encountered under the able leadership of the then Assam Cabinet Minster Dr. Nazrul Islam, the Circle Officer of the Bhuragaon Revenue Circle, and the present CEO, Jila Parishad, Morigaon, respected Sri Kshitish Pegu, and the encroached land of the College was restored successfully. Since then the College has been continuing its best services, sometimes with a smile and at others with sorrow and tears. Among all these, the enrolment was also improving with better results year after year. The ray of hope, which endured so long, came in 2021 with the announcement

of the Provincialization of Educational Institutions by the Assam Government, among whom Bhuragaon College was successfully able to secure a respectable place.

4. Rules and regulations/Graduate Attributes:

- The College has a permanent routine that has to be strictly followed by every student of the college.
- Minimum attendance is set at 75% of every student obtaining below which a student has to strict academic restrictions according to university guidelines.
- The College would urge every student to maintain the dignity and decorum of an educational institution.
- Any undignified and irresponsible or unruly behaviour on the part of the student would not be tolerated and would invite strict disciplinary actions.
- Damaging college property of any kind by any student would be meted with exemplary punishment and the same would have to be adequately compensated.
- The College will issue identity cards to every student every year which has to be with everyone during college hours.
- The College has a canteen and the students are to use it for refreshments. Students are not allowed to leave the college for any reason during college hours except with prior permission from the Authorities.
- Putting on the college uniform is a must for every student.
- The use of Mobile Phones during college hours is prohibited except in emergency or urgent conditions.
- Everyone is urged to an amicable atmosphere to create in the college campus and promote decent behaviour and mannerisms.

5. Admission Procedure:

Aspiring students must apply through "SAMARTH" online Admission portal department of Higher Education, Govt of Assam, Applicant must be generate "Unique ID" from Department of Higher Education. Govt of Assam before applying in the Admission portal. The merit list of the candidates is hung and displayed on the College Notice Board and the College website " bhuragaoncollege.org.in. The applicants are advice to check the college website regularly. Selected candidates are called for counseling followed by verification of their original academic testimonials. Everything is done under the supervision of the Admission Committee of the College. After the verification of the documents is over, the eligible candidates are required to submitted related documents personally on a scheduled date later before which the merit list of the candidates is hung and displayed on the College Notice Board and the College website.

6. Reservation of seats:

As per Government Rules, the Reservation of Seats for the students in the College is shown below:

NB: Reservation is strictly made on verification of the students' submitting their original documents/certificates seeking admission for the above-mentioned categories.

7. Eligibility:

Bhuragaon College sticks to two criteria for students to get admission into the college.

- 1. Selected on a pure merit basis,
- 2. Follows the government reservation rules.

8. Medium of Instruction:

Assamese and English. English and Economics Honours students will write in English in the examinations, and the rest of the Honours students will write either in Assamese or English languages.

9. Academic Profile:

9.1 Courses Offered:

- **9.2 Honours Courses**: Assamese, English, Education, Economics, History, and Political Science. (Geography, Arabic and Philosophy Honours are Apply For)
- **9.3 Regular Courses (Minor)**: English, MIL (Assamese), Elective Assamese, Economics,

Education, Political Science, History, Geography, Philosophy, and Arabic.

9.4 Distance Education: MA (GUCDOE)

Assamese: 80 English: 50 Education: 80

History: 80 Economics: 50

Enrollment in the Regular Courses of each Department would depend on the available infrastructure of the College.

14. Fee: The procedures to collect the fee from the students for the academic session 2025-26 are as per the government of Assam guidelines as stated below:

Applicability: Category of students eligible under the scheme:

- 1. Students whose parental annual income is less than Rs. 4.00 lakh per annum from all sources will be eligible to avail this scheme.
- 2. If either of the parents (mother or father) of the student is working in the State Govt./Central Govt./Semi Govt./State or Central Govt. undertakings, such students shall not be eligible under this scheme.
- 3. Scheme is only for regular students having a minimum 75% of attendance in classes in the previous year/semester with no back paper in the previous examination to be eligible for Fee Waiver claim in the subsequent year/semesters of study.

15. Syllabus of the College:

Bhuragaon College is continuing the CBCS course/syllabus that was introduced by Gauhati University in its affiliated colleges from 2019. This is the final (6th) semester (January 2025-Jun 2025) of the CBCS Programme in the College.

Currently, the College is continuing the FYUGP Programme/Course under NEP-2020. The current FYUGP under NEP is continuing its 4th Semester. The details are listed below:

16. Four-Year Undergraduate Programme (FYUGP) in Arts:

Starting from the academic session of 2023-24, Bhuragaon College has been introducing the FYUGP (Four Years Under Graduate Programme) in Arts aligned with Gauhati University's guidelines based on the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020.

The FYUGP at GU is tailored to accommodate the diverse academic interests of students, allowing for multiple entry and exit points. Students can attain certificates, diplomas, degrees with or without majors, or honours degrees with research, following the provisions outlined in the policy.

Admission to FYUGP

Eligibility:

- 1. A student who has passed 12th standard or equivalent degree from a recognized institution.
- 2. A student can take admission with a preference for a Major subject or otherwise can go for preferences based on other subject combinations.
- 3. The students will be considered eligible for admission to a programme only when he/she fulfills the prerequisites fixed by the university.
 - 4. Admission to the FYUGP will be based on the availability of seats in the college.

Courses:

1. Core Courses, 2. Common Courses.

The program structure entails that students pursue various core courses tailored to their chosen fields, alongside a set of common courses. Below, we outline the curriculum components across different stages of the program.

First Year (Semester I & II)

During the **first year**, students engage with three distinct core subjects, one per semester. Additionally, they delve into a variety of common subjects meticulously crafted according to the UGC's Curricular Framework.

Second Year (Semester III & IV):

- Semester III: In the third semester, students will have the opportunity to switch their major to either of the other two minors, regardless of their initial declaration in the first semester. However, this option is contingent upon academic performance in the first two semesters and the availability of openings.
- Semester IV: Starting from the fourth semester, students will concentrate on their chosen major by undertaking a minimum of four papers, some of which may be elective depending on the field of study. In addition to the four major subjects, students will also have the option to pursue one additional paper as a minor.

Third Year:

In the third year, students will keep learning about their main subject to finish all 15 major papers, along with any optional minor subjects they've chosen.

Fourth Year:

In the fourth year, if students decide to continue, they'll dive into even more advanced courses. These will be like the first-level papers you'd study in a Master's degree program. Plus, they will have the chance to do research projects with their teachers.

Duration:

While under CBCS, one has a 3-year degree program, under the NEP's FYUGP, it is a 4-year degree program.

Exits & Entries:

Under the Choice Based Credit System (CBCS), completing the full 3-year program is necessary to earn a degree. There's no option to leave the program midway. But FYUGP gives

flexibility to the maximum level. In the First Year Undergraduate Programme (FYUGP), however, students have the flexibility to exit the program at different points: after one year, two years, or three years. Exiting after one year results in receiving a certificate. Exiting after two years earns a diploma. Exiting after three years results in a Bachelor's Degree. If a student completes the entire 4-year program, they receive a Bachelor's Degree with Honours.

Honours & Major:

Under the Choice Based Credit System (CBCS), students receive either a Bachelor's Degree with Honours or a standard Bachelor's Degree. In the First Year Undergraduate Programme (FYUGP), after three years, students earn a Bachelor's Degree with a Major. After four years, they receive a degree with a Major and Honours, or a degree with Honours and a Research component.

Progression:

If a student finishes the First Year Undergraduate Programme (FYUGP) after three years, they have to start the first year of a two-year Master's program if they want to continue studying. But if they finish all four years of FYUGP, they can start the second year of a Master's program directly and only need one more year to get their Master's Degree. This wasn't an option under the Choice-Based Credit System (CBCS).

Progression to Doctoral Studies:

After completing either a three-year Bachelor's program or the FYUGP, students can enroll in a Master's program. From there, they can pursue a Doctoral program leading to a PhD degree. If a student performs exceptionally well, they can skip the Master's program and go directly into a Doctoral program after completing the FYUGP.

Core Courses:

The Core Courses a student takes decide what kind of degree, diploma, or certificate he/she'll get when they finish their third (or fourth) year, second year, or first year, respectively. Their performance in these Core Courses also determines their grades in the final exams. They need to earn a minimum of 84 credits in Core Courses, which means they'll study at least 21 courses, each with 4 credits. They have to choose at least three Core subjects from a wide range of options listed in the Subject Details section (https://nep.gauhati.ac.in/). If they are pursuing a Bachelor's Degree in a Stream, their Core Courses will include Majors and/or Minors. But if they're pursuing a Bachelor's Degree in a Discipline, there are no Majors and Minors involved.

Major & Minor:

For a Bachelor's Degree in a Stream, students can either choose a Major along with Minors or just Minors from the available subjects. Regardless, they need to complete a minimum of 21 courses or 84 credits by the third year. A Major course must have at least 60 credits, while a Minor course should have at least 12 credits.

Most students typically choose one Major and two Minors for their Core Courses. However, if a student wishes, they can add a third Minor by utilizing optional core paper credits, as explained earlier.

Common Courses:

The common courses are to be studied by all students alike, and all together they carry a total of 36 credits over 3 years. These courses are further divided into eight (8)

sub-categories, as described below:

Multi-disciplinary Courses:

These are 3-credit courses divided into eight groups: Natural and Physical Science, Mathematical Sciences, Library, Information, and Media Sciences, Commerce and Management, Humanities and Social Sciences, Information and Communication Technologies, Life Sciences, and Earth Sciences. Each student selects three papers from one Multidisciplinary Group.

Ability Enhancement Courses (AEC):

An 8-credit course covering language/Alternative English and English Usage (Communication). Students complete two 4-credit papers: one from English Usage and one from the Language group. Each paper is further divided into two 2-credit courses. Language/Alternative English is taken in Semesters 1 & 5, and English Communication is taken in Semesters 2 & 6.

Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC):

Various skill courses with a total credit allocation of 9. All students complete three skill courses, each with 3 credits, during Semesters 1-3.

Value Added Courses (VAC):

These courses are divided into four subgroups: Understanding India, Environmental Science, Digital and Technological Solutions, and Health & Wellness, Yoga Education, Sports, and Fitness. Together, they have a credit allocation of 6. Each student chooses any three courses, each worth 2 credits, from any three groups during Semesters 1, 2, & 4.

Internship:


All students must complete an Internship worth 4 credits (120 hours). It is expected to be carried out between Semester 4 and 5, but students can also complete it by the end of Semester 6. Internships are scheduled during semester breaks to avoid interfering with classes.

The Fourth Year:

In the FYUGP, the fourth year is equivalent to the first year of a Master's program. After successfully finishing the FYUGP, students can directly enrol in the second year of a Master's program.


In the fourth year, students are required to complete a mandatory paper on Research Methodology (REM) during Semester VII. This paper is worth 4 credits and focuses on theoretical concepts. The remaining courses will include Advanced Core Courses and a Dissertation, depending on whether the student chooses to pursue a Degree (Honours) or a Degree (Honours) with Research.

Multi-disciplinary Subjects:

The multidisciplinary subjects in the GU-FYUGP are designed at a Class XII level. They are divided into eight categories, with each category consisting of three papers. These papers are studied during Semesters 1-3. Here are the categories and their general contents:

- 1. Natural & Physical Sciences
- 2. Mathematical Sciences
- 3. Library, Information & Media Sciences
- 4. Commerce & Management
- 5. Humanities & Social Sciences
- 6. Information & Communication Technologies
- 7. Life Sciences 8. Earth Sciences

Skill Courses:

A student can take any skill course offered by the respective institution during Semesters 1-3.

13. Attendance of students: Students must have 75% attendance. Attendance of all courses, including Skill Enhancement Courses, shall be counted while determining if a student has met the minimum attendance requirements of Gauhati University. In case a student fails to have 75% attendance, he/she will not be allowed to sit in the End Semester Examination, and will be required to repeat the concerned semester after the successful completion of the subsequent semesters to earn the deficit credits. Any student securing less than 75% attendance due to medical grounds will have to apply for medical leave in the prescribed form within 7 days from the date of absence, along with relevant documents/ certificates from an authorized medical officer. However, after accounting for medical leave granted, the minimum attendance will still have to be 75%. If it still remains below 75%, the student will not be allowed to sit in the End Semester Examination. A consideration that is subject condition is that such a student must have at least 60% attendance. For absence due to participation in prescribed co-curricular activities (NCC/NSS/Youth Festival/Sports, etc.), the claim for CCA leave will have to be made in the prescribed form and supported by authenticated certificates from the concerned authorities. However, the minimum attendance after accounting for CCA leave granted will still have to be 75%.

15. Internal Assessment (IA)

Internal Assessment will ideally account for 20% of the total marks allotted in a course/paper.

The Sessional/Mid-term examination will be conducted for 50% of the total marks allotted for IA of a course/paper.

20% of marks allotted for IA will be awarded to the students based on class attendance as

(I) From 76% to 80% attendance: 1 mark

(II) From 81% to 85% attendance: 2 marks

(III) From 86% to 90% attendance: 3 marks

(IV) From 91 and above: 4 marks

The remaining 30% of marks allotted for IA will be distributed and awarded on the basis of the performance of the students on the following criteria:

- (I) Home assignment
- (II) Seminar/Group discussions

- (III) Fieldwork
- (IV) Performance in co-curricular and extra-curricular activities

NB: Subject combinations and Elective papers will be offered as per Gauhati University directions and guidelines.

16. Infrastructure:

- **16.1 Canteen:** The College has a temporary Canteen to facilitate refreshments for the students and staff.
- 16.2 Library: Several assets in a college determine its standard and quality. Various factors play pivotal roles in establishing its academic norms. The library in a college is such a constituent. Bhuragaon College also has a library that has books for use and not for display purposes. Bhuragaon College Library is a collection of other materials also. It contains periodicals, journals, etc. As the College has recently been provincialised, adding innovations and sophistication in terms of digitisation of the record-keeping and associating with other digital media have yet to be done, and we are pleased to ensure it in the days to come. The College Library has subscriptions to various periodicals, journals, etc., along with a reading room facility. The library is kept open throughout the year except on government holidays from 10:00 AM to 4:00 PM.
- **16.3 Laboratory:** The College has laboratories for the Geography Department and the Education Department each with the necessary equipment for practical purposes.
- **16.4 Community Hall cum Seminar Hall:** Bhuragaon College has a Community Hall that was constructed under the Untide Fund of the district Morigaon.

17. Co-Curricular Activities:

17.1 Activities by the Students' Union of the College: This elected student body of the College promotes and organizes sports and cultural activities in the College. This Body manages union functions and activities under the guidance of the teacher. In-charge is appointed by the principal.

18. Teaching, Learning and Evaluation:

Inadequate though, the College has a sufficient number of faculty to run and cater to the basic teaching-learning-evaluation needs of the college. The College is affiliated

with Gauhati University and is governed by rules and regulations regarding the university's teaching, learning, and evaluation norms. Currently, the College is continuing with the University Semester System for all the odd and even semesters and conducting its Internal Assessments applicable to all the departments as and when notified by Gauhati University. Final Examinations are held based on the dates notified.

Modern pedagogical approaches have been rapidly changing. To keep pace with that, the College, amidst financial difficulties, tries to make the students aware of the new and upcoming approaches and pedagogical innovations in the field of teaching and learning and help them, with limited resources, open up Google Classrooms and acquire expertise in handling online classes through Microsoft Teams meet, Google meet, Kahoot, Quizizz, Canva, Google Forms, etc.

Apart from these, the College also holds department Seminars, Group Discussions on given and scheduled topics by the respective departments weekly, bi-weekly, and in an alternating manner.

19. Community Orientation and Social Responsibility (SR)

As has already been mentioned earlier, Bhuragaon College has many challenges, and to face them, it undoubtedly becomes a must to have and establish an amicable and responsible relationship with the people and communities that surround it. We are glad to inform you with pride that the College has continuously been assisted morally and physically by the people around the region. This has made it obligatory for the College to engage in activities that could help uplift its overall development. For that purpose, Bhuragaon College, as and when necessary, goes a step forward with promises to develop and improve areas that are identified as lagging. The College, in the last few years, has taken some measures such as organising free Health Camps, free Eye Check Up camps, awareness camps on Swachh Bharat Abhiyan, Ghar Ghar Jal Programs, and so on. Besides these, it has also been tried organising a Book Fair to motivate people about how to improve reading habits among the masses. Perennial activities to boost a psychological atmosphere among people in the larger region, the College always inspires activities or programs that are supposed to be done in a collaborative mode, strictly associated with the local committees or organisations around the area.

20. Learner Support Services:

- **20.1 Counseling Cell**: Bhuragaon College has a Counseling Cell, and under the strong moral support of the teachers in the College, students have been monitored for better molding for their future and lead forward with interest of their own that would result in a better academic and social life.
- **20.2 Scholarship Programme**: For the academic development and growth of the students, Bhuragaon College keeps provisions for scholarships according to the

state government norms to the students belonging to the scheduled tribes, scheduled castes, other backward classes, and religious minorities through the National Scholarship Portal (NSP).

Besides, solely based on philanthropy, the college also takes pain in arranging means to get poorer students from backward families to get uninterrupted education in their lives.


